 documentation. Deadline is June1. Applications must be postmarked by this date. Late applications will
 not be accepted.
- Participation in a testing program with scores at 80% or higher for at least 2 years.
- Tested up to the equivalency of AIM Level 6 (see the attached sheet for a breakdown of the requirements for Level 6)
- Show that you have been tested in the following areas: Performance, Theory, Ear Training, Sight Reading, and Technique. The AIM program also has a Creative Musicianship portion that requires students to prepare a "report" or "project" on a music subject.
- A commitment that once accepted as a member, you will participate in the FAIM activities. To be an active
 member, students must participate in one performance and one service activity per year. There will be
 several of each of these activities planned per year. Sign and date the FAIM Agreement. It must be signed
 by both teacher and student.
- A registration fee of \$10 the first year and then \$5 each year after that.

As a member of FAIM, you will be able to enjoy meeting students who are top-notch musicians, enjoy participating in many activities as a group including performing opportunities, and after two years of active membership, be able to apply for \$200 scholarships. The first year you are a member, you will receive a gold medallion that each year after that you can add gold pin to the ribbon.

AIM Level 6 Requirements

Technique

Scales: 4 forms of scales 3 or more octaves and chromatic scales 3 or more octaves. All hands together. Chords: Inversions of Dominant 7ths and Diminished 7ths. Know and be able to play the 6 qualities of the 7th chords.

Arpeggios: Covered M,m, dim, and Aug arpeggios 3 or more octaves in previous levels Be able to play Dominant 7th and Diminished 7th arpeggios.

Cadences: Complete Authentic cadences in root and inversions hands together.

Theory

Be able to write all Major and minor key signatures on the staff.

Be able to write M, m, dim, and Aug. intervals on the staff.

Know the diatonic names of major scales.

Be able to write the circle of 5ths Major and minor keys

Know how to conduct time signatures and be familiar with the names of all types of meters. Be able to write fill in counting on complex rhythms.

Be able to write out scales in parallel keys. (Relative keys were covered previously)

Be able to write out cadences with single tone bass. Also, be able to write out chords M,m, dim, and Aug. in root position and inversions.

Be familiar with terms and analysis of imitation, Minuet and Trio, ABA, Ternary Form, grave, mordent, alla breve, marcato, non troppo, etc.

Cover music history including Romantic period, symphonies, dance forms, pedals, and modes.

Ear Training

Two measure melodic dictation. Single line melody- first note given.

Rhythmic dictation including 16ths.

Dominant 7ths and diminished 7ths

Cadences: Plagal and authentic in root position and inversions

Intervals including M2, m3, M7, and P8.

Scales: Major, Phrygian, and natural minor
